### **Activities**

During their time in the Pack, Cub Scouts will get a chance to try lots of different activities like swimming, canoeing, exploring, cooking and collecting.

There are a range of badges available which Cub Scouts can wear on their uniforms to show everyone how well they are doing.

Cub Scouts also get to go on trips and days out, to places like the zoo, Science museum, Duxford. Sometimes they will be able to go camping with the rest of the Pack and take part in all kinds of outdoor activities.

### **Structure and organisation**

A Pack of Cub Scouts is organised into Sixes, with each Six named after a colour, and a Sixer and a Secunder in charge.

## **Uniform**

Cubs wear a green sweatshirt and a necker to show they belong to Waltham Abbey.

On pack nights, they should come in **plain** navy blue joggers in cool weather and navy blue shorts in hot weather. Trainers are acceptable.

For parades, cubs should be smart. The necker should be ironed and the sweatshirt clean and pressed. School trousers and black school shoes are expected. Black trainers will be accepted if the cub really has no other shoes.

And do a good turn every day.

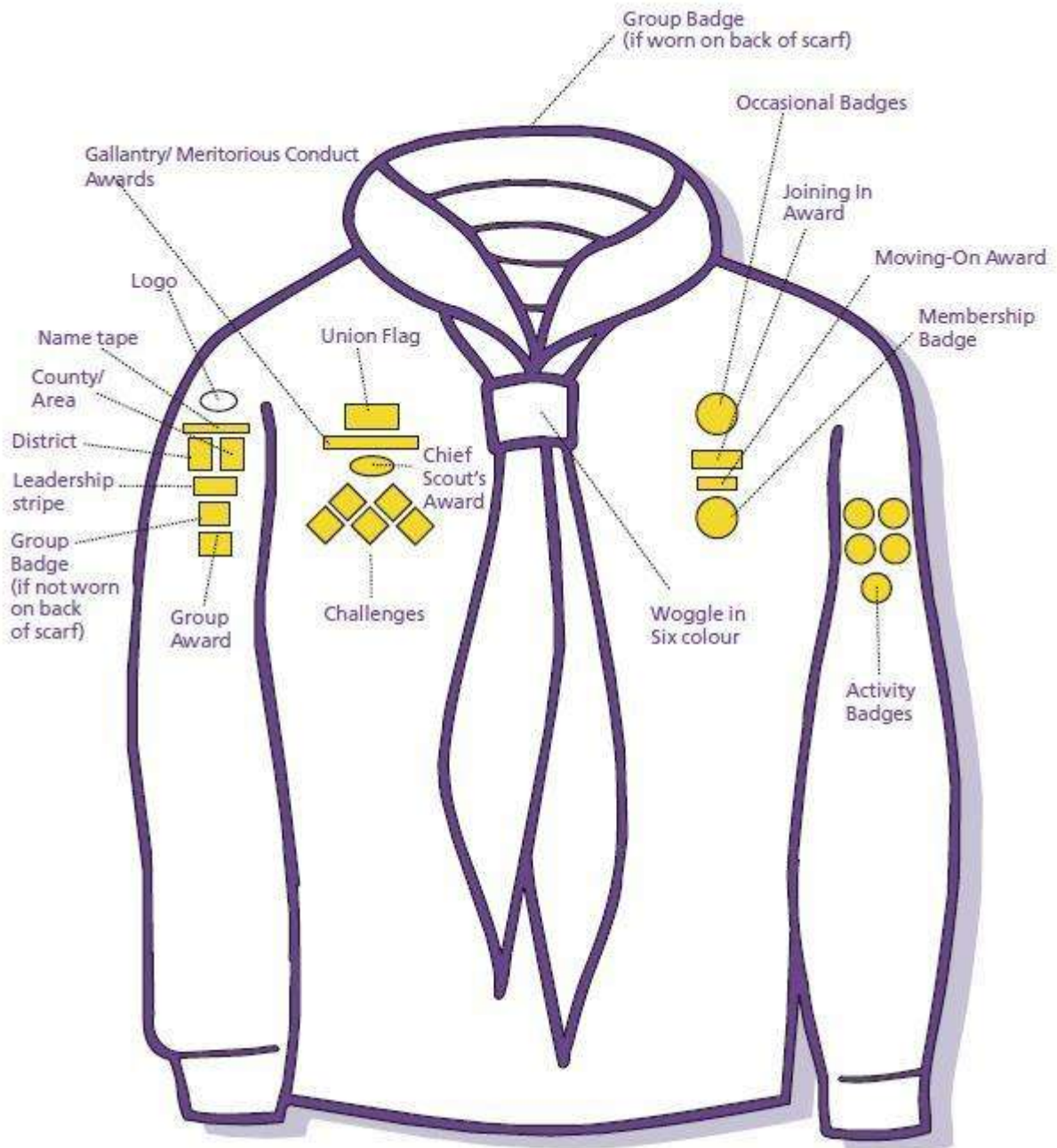
## **The Cub Scout Motto:**
